MADISON COUNTY FACILITIES TO REOPEN TO PUBLIC ACCESS ON MONDAY, MAY 4, 2020

Huntsville, Alabama – The Madison County Commission will reopen all County facilities to public access on Monday, May 4, 2020, including the Madison County Courthouse, District offices, and Satellite locations. In compliance with the Safer at Home issued by Alabama Governor Kay Ivey, all Madison County-owned community and recreation centers remain closed to the public.

The Madison County Tax Assessor and Tax Collector will be available at the Madison County Courthouse and Madison Satellite offices.

To assist residents when visiting County facilities, signage and prompts will visually display the requirement of cloth face coverings, hand sanitizing, and social distancing. In facilities with line queuing for services, indicators are positioned to demonstrate the required six-foot separation. In facilities with seating for residents, seating is adjusted to allow for six-foot separation.

Residents and employees entering county facilities must:

- Wear personal cloth face coverings to enter, and always while in publicly accessible areas of Madison County facilities
- Sanitize hands upon facility entry prior to security screening
- Maintain six feet of physical distancing. In instances where physical distancing cannot be maintained (I.e. in elevators) a personal cloth face covering will be required.

Madison County continues to maintain a safe environment in all county facilities. These measures include:

- Continuous cleaning and sanitizing of all entry and exit doors and handles; elevators; hard surfaces including flooring; stair handrails; and bathroom fixtures and facilities
- Hand sanitizer and soap dispensers

Madison County residents are encouraged to continue utilizing our website – www.madisoncountyal.gov – to access information and conduct county business. Additionally, we encourage everyone to continue monitoring the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), The Alabama Department of Public Health (ADPH) and other public resources to receive health-related information on COVID-19.
